First Reading
A Reading from the Book of Jeremiah.
(Jeremiah 8:4-7 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Prophet Jeremiah.

Tell the people of Judea: "Thus says God - When someone falls, do they not rise again? If they turn away, do they not turn back? Why then are these people in constant rebellion? Why do they cling to deception, and refuse to return?


I have listened closely; they speak what is not true. No one regrets wickedness; no one says, 'What have I done?' Everyone keeps running their course, like a horse dashing into battle.

Lector: Return to God, the Beloved.

Lector: Throughout the ages, the lover of the universe has shown the marvels of creation, of wonders to behold. All through the ages, Earth has yielded its bountiful harvest. When will we attune our hearts to the music of the Earth's rhythms? Who will rouse us from our apathy and quicken our spirits that we might serve the God of Love?

People Respond: Return to God, the Beloved.

Lector: Who will awaken our sleeping minds? Who will lift up our hearts to the Truth? Greed has become the great destroyer of life, taking without offering back, consuming Earth's bounty with abandon, leaving death, disease, and destruction in its wake.

Second Reading A Reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans. (Romans 10:5-8,10-13 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans.

Moses writes this about the righteousness, that is, by the law: "The person who does these things will live by them."

But the righteousness, that is, by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will make it up into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down), or 'Who will go down into the abyss?" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead).

But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart." For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess and are healed.

As Scripture says, "No one who believes in Me will be put to shame." There is no difference between Jew and Gentile - the same God is God of all and richly blesses all who call upon his Holy Name. Indeed, "Everyone who calls on the name of the God will be heard."

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke. (Luke 4:1-13 (CCL))

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ be with you all.

Celebrant: A reading from the Good News attributed to Luke.

After his baptism, Jesus returned from the Jordan filled with the Holy Spirit and was led into the desert for forty days. There he was tested by the Devil, the Voice of Embodied Evil. Jesus ate nothing at all during those days.

After exhausting every test, the Devil left Jesus, until the opportune moment.


Celebrant: The Gospel of Jesus the Christ according to Luke.
