Liturgy of the Word

First Reading A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. (Isaiah 50:4-9 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning God wakens, wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught.

God has opened my ear. I know my lot. I was not rebellious; I did not turn back from suffering. Instead, I gave my back to those who struck me, and turned my cheek to those who pulled out my beard.

I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. God is my helper: I have set my face like flint. Shame is not mine.

The One who vindicates is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let us talk face to face. If God is the one who helps me, who can declare me guilty?

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Respond: Thanks be to God.



Responsorial Psalm (Spoken) (Psalm 62:1-4, 8-9, 11-12 (CCL))

Lector: In Your silence, O God, we find strength.

People Respond: In Your silence, O God, we find strength.

Lector: In the hush of God, my soul finds rest, and liberation comes. In the silent strength of God, I shall not be greatly shaken.

People Respond: In Your silence, O God, we find strength.

Lector: How long can one be assailed? How long till a tottering fence, or a leaning wall, topples. Some have been counseled in but one purpose; to bring another down. Delighting in falsehood, they bless with their mouths, while in their hearts, they curse.

People Respond: In Your silence, O God, we find strength.

Lector: Those who are true to their word, even at a high price; Those who lend without interest, and accept no bribe against the innocent. Those who do these things can never be shaken.

People Respond: In Your silence, O God, we find strength.

Lector: Surely the children of Adam and Eve are but a breath. Those born of humans are ephemeral. Weighed together, they are lighter than air. So, should your riches increase, do not set your heart on them. Trust in God at all times, in all things. Pour out your heart to the God who embraces you.

People Respond: In Your silence, O God, we find strength.

Lector: One thing God has said, two things have I heard: "Yours alone, O God, is the Power, the power that is Unfailing Love;" and "You repay everyone according to their lives and loves."

People Respond: In Your silence, O God, we find strength.

Second Reading

A Reading from the First Letter of Peter.

(1 Peter 1:2-7; 3:13-18 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the First Letter of Peter.

To the exiles of the Diaspora...May grace and peace be yours in abundance.

Blessed be the God of Jesus the Christ! In great compassion, God gave us new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus the Christ from the dead. We now have an inheritance that does not fail. This is your treasure, awaiting you when your time comes.

You, by the power of God, are safeguarded through faith, to a wholeness that will ultimately be revealed. In this you rejoice! Although now - for a little while - you may have to suffer various trials. In the trials you may suffer, the genuineness of your faith will be tested, like gold in a refiner's fire. However, your faith is more precious than gold. Gold can perish.

May the genuineness of your faith prove stronger than gold. May it prove to be for the praise, glory, and honor of Jesus the Christ. Now, who is going to harm you if you are enthusiastic for doing good? But even if you should suffer for doing the right thing, blessed are you. Do not be afraid or terrified. Do not fear those who seek to hurt you. Rather, revere Jesus the Christ in your hearts.

Always be ready to explain to anyone who asks, the reason for your hope; but do it with gentleness and respect, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may be ashamed for their slander. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark. (Mark 8:27-37 (CCL))

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ be with you all.

People Respond: And also, with you. Celebrant: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark.

People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

Jesus journeyed on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi. On the way, he asked his disciples: "Who do people say that I am?" They answered, "John the Baptist. Others say Elijah. Still others, one of the prophets."

Then Jesus asked them: "But you... who do you say that I am?" Peter answered: "You are the Anointed One, You are the Christ." Jesus sternly told them not to tell anyone about him.

Immediately, Jesus began to teach them that the Incarnate One, the Anointed One, must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and religious lawyers. He must be killed, and after three days, rise again. Jesus said all this quite openly. (Gospel continued on the next page.)

Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him. Turning, and looking at the disciples, Jesus rebuked Peter saying: "Get behind me, Satan! Your mind is not set on the things of God, but on human things."


Jesus called to the crowd, as well as his disciples. He said to all of them: "If any want to become my followers, you can no longer live for yourself. You must take up your cross and follow me. Those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit you to gain the whole world and forfeit your soul, your very life? Indeed, for what could you ever trade your life?"
