#### First Reading A Reading from the Book of Exodus. (Exodus 3:7-12 (Episcopal))

Lector: A reading from the Book of Exodus.

Then Yahweh said: "I have seen the affliction of my people in Egypt. I have heard their cries under those who oppress them. Indeed, I have felt their sufferings. Now I have come down to rescue them from the hand of Egypt, out of their place of suffering, and to bring them to a place that is broad and good land, a land flowing with milk and honey - the land of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites, and Jebusites.



Lector: A reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Ephesians.


Draw your strength from Christ and from the strength of his mighty power. Put on the whole armor of God so that you can stand firm against the tactics of the devil.

Our struggle, ultimately, is not against human forces, but against sovereignties and authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, and against evil spiritual forces in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to hold your ground. Stand fast then, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of justice; and hold fast to the zeal in which you spread the Good News, wearing shoes on your feet, making you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. In all circumstances, hold faith up before you as your shield; it will help to quench the flaming arrows of the Evil One. Put on the helmet of salvation, and carry the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

Always pray in the Spirit, with all your prayers and petitions. Pray constantly and attentively for all of God's holy people. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, God will open my mouth and place the words on my lips, that I may boldly make known the mystery of the Gospel - that mystery for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may have the courage to proclaim it boldly, as I ought.

Jesus said: "I say: Love your enemies. Do good to those who hate you. Bless those who curse you, and pray for those who mistreat you. When they slap you on one cheek, turn and give them the other also. When they take away your coat, let them have your shirt as well. Give to all who beg from you. When someone takes what is yours, do not ask for it back.

"Do to others what you would have them do to you. If you love those who love you, what credit does that do you? Even 'sinners' love those who love them. If you do good only to those who do good to you, what credit does that do you? Even 'sinners' do as much. If you lend to those whom you expect to repay you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to other 'sinners,' expecting to be repaid in full.

"Love your enemies and do good to them. Lend without expecting repayment in return, and your reward will be great. You'll rightly be children of the most glorious God, since God is kind and full of compassion, even to the ungrate-ful and the wicked.

And so I say to You: "Be compassionate, just as your God is heaven is compassionate."


Celebrant: The Gospel of Jesus the Christ according to Luke.
