Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

A reading from the Books of Leviticus and Exodus. (Leviticus 17:11-12,14 & Exodus 24:3-8 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Books of Leviticus and Exodus.

God said to Moses: "The life of a living creature is in its blood. Therefore, I have told you Israelites that neither you, nor any alien who resides among you, shall eat blood... For the life of every creature is in its blood. Its blood is its life..."

Later, Moses came to the people, and told them all the words and ordinances of God. Rising early the next day, he erected an altar at the foot of the mountain and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent selected young Israelites to Offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to God, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls. The other half, he splashed on the altar.

Taking the Book of the Covenant, Moses read it aloud to all the people who answered: "All that God has said, we will observe and do." Then he took blood and sprinkled it on the people saying: "This is the blood of the covenant that God has made with you in according to God's words."

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Respond: Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm (Spoken) (Psalm 116:12-13, 14-16, 17-19 (CCL))

Lector: We will eat the Bread of Life and drink the cup of Love.

People Respond: We will eat the Bread of Life and drink the cup of Love.

Lector: What shall I return to God for the bounty that I have been shown? I will raise the cup of Love, the cup of wholeness, and call upon You who have done wondrous things. I will call upon the Name of God.

People Respond: We will eat the Bread of Life and drink the cup of Love.

Lector: I will bear witness to You, O Bread of Life, in the presence of all people. Precious and too costly in Your eyes is the death of even one of Your own. O God, giver of life, I am Your servant, and my descendants were Your servant. You have loosed my bonds.

People Respond: We will eat the Bread of Life and drink the cup of Love.

Lector: Lifting the cup, I will offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving, and call upon the Name of God. I will bear witness to You, O Bread of Life, in the presence of all people.

People Respond: We will eat the Bread of Life and drink the cup of Love.

Second Reading

A Reading from Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (1 Cori nthians11:23-26 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians.

For I received from Jesus the Christ what I also handed onto you: That on the night he was handed over, he took bread; and, after He had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way, after supper, he took the cup saying, "This is my blood, the cup of the new covenant. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Christ Jesus, until He comes.

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Respond: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Acclamation (Alleluia)

People Respond: Alleluia! Alleluia!

Celebrant: And Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever."

People Respond: Alleluia! Alleluia!

A Reading from the Gospel according to Mark. (Mark 14:12-13, 16, 22-26 (CCL))

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ be with you all.

Gospel

People Respond: And also, with you.

Celebrant: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark.

People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

On the day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread - the Passover - when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples went off into the city, and they prepared the Passover.

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, He said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them saying: "Take this and eat. This is my body."

Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them. They all drank from it, and He said to them: "This is my blood of the covenant which will be shed for many."

Celebrant: The Gospel of Jesus the Christ according to Mark.


People Respond: Praise to you, Jesus the Christ.
