Liturgy of the Word

First Reading
A Reading from the Book of Isaiah.
(Isaiah 6:1-8 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Holy One sitting on a throne, high and lofty. The hem of God's robe filled the Temple. Above, seraphim were in attendance. Each had six wings: with two, they covered their faces; with two. they covered their feet; and with two, they hovered.

Calling out to one another, they cried: "Holy, holy, holy is the God of the universe, whose glory fills the earth." The threshold shook to its foundations at the sound, while the Temple began to fill with smoke.

Then I said: "Woe is me! I am doomed. For I am of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips. Yet my eyes have seen the Ruler of All, the God of the universe."

Then one of the seraphim flew to me, holding a live coal which the creature had taken with tongs from the altar. With this, it touched my mouth and said, "Look, this has touched your lips. Your guilt has fled. Your misdeeds have been blotted out."

Then I heard the voice of God saying, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" And I said, "Here I am, send me!"

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Respond: Thanks be to God.



Responsorial Reading (Spoken) (Psalm 29:1-2, 4,7-11 (CCL))

Lector: Glory to You, O God. Bless us with peace.

People Respond: Glory to You, O God. Bless us with peace.

Lector: Ascribe to God, O divine beings, ascribe to God glory and strength! Give to God the glory due the Holy Name! Adore the Beloved in holy splendor!

People Respond: Glory to You, O God. Bless us with peace.

Lector: God's voice is strong. God's voice is full of majestic beauty. God's voice strikes with fire upon hearts of stone. God's voice shakes the desert and unsettles us. God's voice uproots oaks, stripping forests bare; God uproots fear and strips egos bare.

People Respond: Glory to You, O God. Bless us with peace.

Lector: But in God's temple, and in the heart's chapel, all cry, "Glory!" For the voice of God is still heard in every storm! God remains God - always. Give strength to Your people, O God. Bless Your people with peace.

People Respond: Glory to You, O God. Bless us with peace.

Second Reading A Reading from Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. (1 Corinthians 15:1-11 (CCL))

Lector: A reading from Paul's first Letter to the Corinthians.

Beloved, I want to remind you of the gospel - the good news - that I proclaimed to you. You made the gospel your own, and you have taken your stand on it. If you hold firm to the word that I proclaimed to you, you will be free; you will not have be-lieved in vain. What I received, I also passed on to you at the outset:

- that Jesus died as a servant of all, according to the Scriptures; that he was buried;
- **★** that the Christ was raised on the third day, according to the Scriptures;
- that the risen Christ appeared to Mary Magdalene and Peter, and then to Jesus' closest followers;
- ★ that the risen Christ later appeared to more than 500 of the disciples at the same time, most of whom are still living, although some have since died;
- ★ that the risen Christ spent time with James and all the rest of the apostles who were commissioned to continue Jesus' good work;
- **★** and that, last of all, the risen Christ appeared to me, as to one untimely born.

I am the least of all the apostles and don't even deserve to be called an apostle because I persecuted the church of God; but, by God's grace, I am what I am. This grace was not without effect, for I have reached out to the Gentiles more than all the others.


Yet it was not I who did it, but God's grace that was in me. So, whether you heard it from me, or from the others, it's all the same. This is what we proclaim. This is what you believed.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke. (Luke 4:38-44 (CCL))

Celebrant: May the Word of Christ be with you all.

People Respond: And also, with vou.

Celebrant: A reading from the Good News attributed to Luke.

People Respond: † Glory to you, O God.

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus entered the house of Simon and his family. Simon's mother-in-law was in the grip of a high fever. They asked Jesus to help her. Jesus stood over her and rebuked the fever. The fever left her. She got up immediately and began to serve them at table.

At sunset, people who had a variety of diseases were brought to Jesus. He laid hands on each and cured them. Demons departed from many, crying out as they did so, "You are the Chosen One of God!" Jesus rebuked them and forbade them to speak that they knew he was the Messiah.

The next morning, Jesus left the house and went to a desert place. The crowds followed. When they found Jesus, they tried to keep him from leaving them. Jesus said: "I must proclaim the Good News of God's reign to other towns too. That is what I was sent to do."

And he preached in the synagogues throughout Judea.

Celebrant: The Gospel of Jesus the Christ according to Luke.

People Respond: Praise to you, Jesus the Christ.
