CELEBRANT'S GREETING of the PEOPLE:

We begin our liturgy by blessing the name of our God with the sign of our faith: **+** In the name of God, who is both Mother and Father to us, and of Jesus the Only-Begotten One, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: May the grace of Jesus the Christ, the love of God, and the fire of the Holy Spirit be with you.

People: And also, with you.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Celebrant: As we begin our liturgy, we pause to remember times when we have failed to answer the call of the gospel in our relationship with God, with one another, and in loving of ourselves.

Celebrant: Lord have mercy

People: Lord have mercy.

Celebrant: Christ have mercy

People: Christ have mercy

Celebrant: Lord have mercy

People: Lord have mercy

Celebrant: May God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. **Amen.**

GLORY TO GOD (spoken; omitted @ Advent & Lent)

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to all people on earth. O God, heavenly King, almighty God, and Father. We worship you; we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father. Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us. You are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. **Amen.**

OPENING PRAYER – Offered by Celebrant

LITURGY OF THE WORD

RESPONSE AT CONCLUSION OF EACH READING:

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people

People: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION – ALLELUIA

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to **N**

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ +++

At conclusion of the Gospel:

Celebrant: The Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, Jesus the Christ.

HOMILY

NICENE CREED (All)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen. We believe in Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of God - God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, one in Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became truly human.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered, died, and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his reign will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father; who with the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. **Amen.**

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

An invitation will be extended during this time for anyone to offer up personal prayer intentions aloud.

SIGN OF PEACE

Celebrant: Jesus said to the disciples, "I leave you peace, my gift is my peace to you." Look not on our sins but on the faith of your church, and grant us the peace and unity of God's reign forever. May the peace of the Risen Christ be with each of you.

People: And also, with you.

Celebrant: Let us offer one another a sign of Christ's peace. *(We exchange the Sign of Peace through safely distanced greetings.)*

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

BLESSING OF BREAD AND WINE SOMETIMES, *this is not audible. When the Celebrant prays aloud, first over the bread, and then, over the wine, the people's response is as follows:*

Celebrant: Blessed are You, God of all creation...

People: Blessed be God forever.

Celebrant: Pray, friends, that in this sharing of bread and wine, that our lives will be acceptable to our God who is Life, Love, Healing, and Justice.

ALL: May God accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name

PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS – Offered by Celebrant

Celebrant: Let us pray....

PREFACE DIALOGUE

Celebrant: God be with you.

People: And also, with you.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.
(Celebrant continues prayer)

HOLY, HOLY (spoken)

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of our God. Hosanna in the highest.

CONSECRATION

MYSTERY OF FAITH (spoken)

Celebrant: Let us proclaim the mystery of faith...

Christ has died, Christ has risen, Christ will come again.

Or:

When we eat this bread, and drink this cup, we proclaim Your death, O Jesus, until you come in glory.

Or:

We proclaim your death, O Jesus, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

DOXOLOGY (spoken)

People: Through Christ, with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours O God, forever and ever.

GREAT AMEN (spoken)

PRAYER OF JESUS (spoken)

Celebrant: Let us pray with confidence for the coming of the reign of God in the words our savior taught us:

(All) Our Father in heaven, holy is your name! Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

Celebrant: Deliver us from every evil and grant us peace. In your mercy, keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety, as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our savior, Jesus Christ.

People: For the kingdom, power and glory are yours, now and forever.

LAMB OF GOD (spoken)

Celebrant: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world...

People: Have mercy on us.

Celebrant: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world...

People: Have mercy on us.

Celebrant: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world...

People: Grant us peace.

PRAYER OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION (All)

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

Celebrant: We are the Body of Christ...

People: Healed and made one in the Spirit. Amen.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Celebrant: We are all one in Christ Jesus, who freely gives Himself to us in His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Because it is Jesus' Table, not ours, ALL are welcome to come, receive, and be united with Him.

POST-COMMUNION PRAYER– Offered by Celebrant

Celebrant: Let us pray....

CLOSING BLESSING

Celebrant: May the grace of God be with you.

People: And also, with you.

Celebrant: Bow your heads and pray for God's blessing. And may the God of All bless us, + in the name of the Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. And let the church say:

People: AMEN!

SENDING FORTH

Celebrant: Our Mass has ended, but our service to God and His people continues. Go forth in peace, with hearts open to love.

People: Thanks be to God.
